7. Interaction with Media Policy

Chuyue (Angela) Qin introduced the item and highlighted the changes made in 2.2, 4.1.3, 4.2, 5.2, 5.3, and 6.1. Most of these changes are updates for relevance since the AUU has created the new "Head of Engagement" position.

Gary Sutherland asked definition 2.4 to be amended to "The Head of Engagement".

The board discussed 5.1 and whether it is still relevant to retain in the schedule.

Billy Zimmermann raised a question towards the inclusion of On Dit in 6.1, as well as whether removing the original 6.1 limit the power of SRC. He raised that it would be better for the AUU staff to oversee the media release instead of the president.

Chuyue (Angela) Qin clarified that the original 6.1 actually limits SRC since they have to notify the head of engagement under the old rule, hence removing it would actually simplify the process. Moreover, she highlighted most of the media release power actually lies in the head of engagement, and that interviews could be approved by two out of the president, EO or the head of engagement, removing the potential bias.

Mat Monti questioned why the changes are brought up at a change of term. Isaac Trumble replied that it is because this rule has not been revised for some time and need to be updated for relevance.

Isaac Trumble moved that the motion to be put.
